A Message from the Dean & Rector

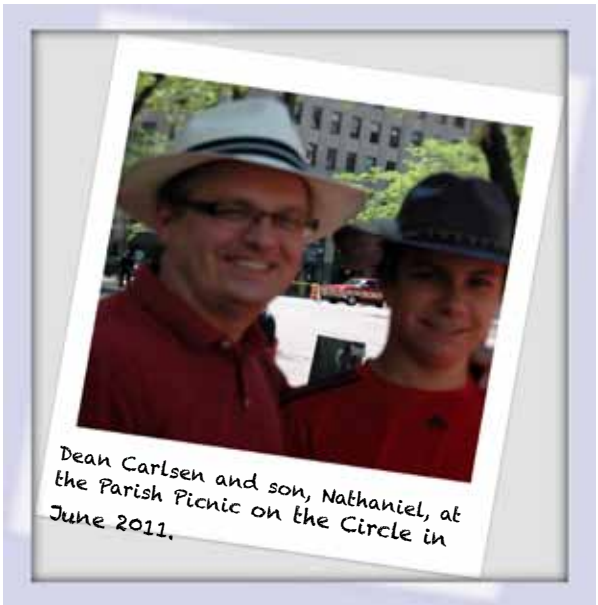
For this year's report, I am happy to say that our work has been overwhelmingly up in our congregation and our community. Previous annual reports and the years they represent have been dominated by events that have required much congregational attention: in 2010, it was the earthquake in Haiti and the search for a new Organist-Choirmaster, in 2009 the onset of the Great Recession and the discernment about the future of our choirs after Fred Burgomaster's retirement, and in 2008, the transition associated with my arrival as dean. 2011, by contrast, allowed for much greater focus on our core ministry and mission. While work in Haiti continued, as did adjusting our budget for the lowest year of endowment income, and despite some staff transition, these tasks did not distract from work on evangelism, our liturgical life, musical excellence and outreach into our community.

At the beginning of the year, at its annual retreat, the Vestry made evangelism its top priority for the year's work. The Vestry approved a vision statement for Evangelism: "We strive to be Christ's living presence in this work, sharing our experience of His love with everyone we encounter, seeing Christ's living presence in them." This emphasis and vision motivated much of our work this year. Overall staff goals were established, with concrete objectives put in place to achieve them. These resulted in, among other things: the Magnetic Church conference held at the Cathedral; the launching of a new series of classes held off site on Massachusetts Avenue; and the formation of a task force that reported to the Vestry this month, recommending specific actions to improve our invitation, welcome and inclusion of newcomers to Christ Church Cathedral. This work will continue in the coming year.

Dana Marsh settled in productively and launched an impressive series of events and concerts in addition to musical offerings in our liturgies. A partial list includes a concert by the King's Singers, a series of fine Lenten

concerts, a visit from the American Boychoir, concerts featuring, Bach's St. John Passion, the Mozart Requiem, Handel's Messiah, as well as singing the Fauré Requiem for All Souls', and Advent Lessons and Carols both at the Cathedral and introducing it to the Christian Theological Seminary. The choirs rose funds for a tour to the National Cathedral with an auction at the Columbia Club, which had to be cancelled when the National Cathedral was closed due to earthquake and hurricane. Our boys and girls have shown remarkable patience as they wait for their funds to be used and the trip rescheduled this coming June. We enjoyed much classical music from the Hispanic tradition with both a tribute to Tomas Luis de Victoria and a colonial Christmas with carols from the New World. Dana was also able to reach out into the community and directed a festival choir from seven area high schools at the Palladium, in a performance of the Fauré Requiem. It was a truly remarkable year for us musically.

If music making is one of our passions, the other is outreach into the community. Between Cathedral Women, Mission outreach and Haiti relief, we gave \$1,406,780 away in 2011, all outlined later in this report. Fred Andrews, assisted often by Andy McConnell, helped 813 people who came to our doors in need on Tuesday mornings. We established a new partnership with Second Helpings, giving them a grant and also helping plant an herb garden. We

continue to be involved with Dayspring shelter for families, tending their gardens, while our middle school students gather donations this month. Through directed giving parishioners gave designated gifts toward our Human Needs ministry as well as continuing our support for the Interfaith Hunger Initiative. And many people were active giving, serving and reaching out to needy families at the beginning of school with the

backpacks and at Christmas with the Adopt-A-Family program.

As a church for our city, we were active welcoming the homeless on Sundays and throughout the week. We welcomed the homeless, community leaders and the Mayor on Dec. 21 for the annual memorial service for homeless persons who died over the past year. We, for the firsttime, participated in the interfaith Thanksgiving service at the Cathedral of Sts. Peter and Paul, benefiting the Interfaith Hunger Initiative. Our Hispanic members put up a Día de Los Muertos altar at the Indianapolis Arts Center in Broad Ripple. Fathers and Families Resource Center held their graduation ceremonies again at the Cathedral, five twelve-step groups meet weekly here, with a sixth Spanish-language group being planned. We were a part of the annual Fiesta Latina. And of course, our Strawberry Festival was again a hallmark of the year.

Our reach extended internationally in our continued engagement with the Diocese of Central Ecuador. Because of internal conflict there, we didn't send a mission team this year, but remained supportive as the Presiding Bishop reached a resolution to the conflict there. We immediately reached out to help after this reconciliation. Mission trips there are being planned for the coming year. In Sudan, we complete the work building at the Mark Nichols school. In Brazil we continued to support the CASA+ aids hostel. And finally in Haiti, we welcomed Bishop Zache Duracin and presented him with our gift toward the reconstruction of Holy Trinity Cathedral. We established a partnership between our Diocese and Ste. Andre in Mithon. Several groups made trips to Haiti. Our generosity encouraged other major gifts toward Haiti, including a gift from the Diocese matching our own \$500,000 commitment.

As a Cathedral for our Diocese, we also welcomed an ever larger diocesan confirmation service, all clergy for the Maundy Thursday renewal of ordination vows and neighboring parishes of St. Alban's and St. Philip's for Twelfth Night.

Even as we learned to better welcome newcomers, made glorious music and served others, we also tended the health of our own community. We learned, with many opportunities, to grow spiritually. My Sunday forum continues to attract good and active groups. In the fall we learned about Immigration issues from one of our own activist young persons and how we might respond faithfully. The Catechumenate continues to

attract new persons into our congregation, to renewed faith, and some to baptism. This fall we started an Education for Ministry group, with 10 people committing to four years of intensive study and reflection. More groups are planned. During Lent, professor Paul Valliere taught us about the Jesus Prayer and the Way of the Pilgrim. Finally, we along with Seabury-Western Theological Seminary, we engaged with cutting-edge scholars who presented their retrieval of early Christian themes in the Saving Paradise weekend.

We also set aside time just to enjoy being together. We had two picnics on the circle to begin and end our summer schedule, with games, Mariachi, tents and much fun. We celebrated the Day of the Dead, cross culturally. One altar was the “British Altar,” perhaps the first ever anywhere! The auction raising money for our choir trip was a fun gathering for all. There were various receptions and meals together, after Advent Lessons and Carols, after the Christmas Pageant, and for Mothering Sunday. Thirty-five persons gathered for lunch and the Greening of the Church.

It is important to note transitions in leadership. Canon Rees Olander retired in June after 15 years and too many accomplishments to mention. Tom Craig was hired soon after her retirement and has made a great start in overseeing our resources—financial, capital and human. The Rev. Whitney Rice went to her new parish in Bean Blossom, and our new Curate, The Rev. Andy Shamel, began this summer. Simon Thomas Jacobs joined us as our Fellow in Sacred Music.

Finally, we give thanks for the leadership shown by members of this congregation in the Vestry. Jennifer Segner has served as our clerk for three years, keeping our official record of Vestry proceedings. Deb Jones, Bob Goyette and Andy McConnell end their terms as Vestry Members. Their commitment and passion for Christ Church Cathedral has been very evident. Andy, in particular, has served as both Junior and Senior Warden. He brought fresh insight and wisdom beyond his years to us.

I am thankful to have served with them this past year and look forward to another year in service to Christ at the Cathedral. The events described in this report are only a portion of the life that is ours in this place. May God bless our life and ministry together in the year ahead.



Informe del Dean y Rector

El Muy Rev. Stephen Carlsen

Este año, estoy feliz al reportarles que nuestro trabajo ha sido especialmente en la construcción de nuestra congregación y nuestra comunidad. Los informes anuales anteriores y los años que ellos representan han estado dominados por acontecimientos que han requerido mucha atención de la congregación: en el 2010, fue el terremoto en Haití y la búsqueda de un nuevo organista, director del coro, en 2009 fue el comienzo de la Gran Recesión y el discernimiento sobre el futuro de nuestros coros después de la jubilación Fred Burgomaster y en el 2008 la transición asociada a mi llegada como deán. El 2011 por el contrario, permitió centrarse mucho más en nuestro ministerio y misión. Mientras que el trabajo en Haití continúa, al igual que el ajuste de nuestro presupuesto para el año mas bajo que los ingresos de las donaciones y a pesar de algunas transiciones del personal, estas tareas no distraen la atención para trabajar en la evangelización, la vida litúrgica, la excelencia musical y la divulgación en nuestra comunidad.

A principios del año, la Junta Parroquial en su retiro anual hizo su prioridad principal la evangelización para el trabajo del año. La Junta Parroquial aprobó una declaración de visión para evangelismo: “Nos esforzamos por ser presencia viva de Cristo en este trabajo, compartiendo nuestra experiencia de su amor con todo el mundo que nos encontramos, al ver la presencia viva de Cristo en ellos.” El énfasis y la visión motivando gran parte de nuestro trabajo de este año. Esto dio como resultado, entre otras cosas: la conferencia de la Iglesia magnética en la Catedral, el lanzamiento de una nueva serie de clases fuera de las instalaciones de la iglesia, en la Avenida Massachussets, y la formación de un grupo de trabajo que informó a la Junta Parroquial de este mes, recomendando acciones concretas para mejorar nuestra invitación, bienvenida y la inclusión de los recién llegados a la Catedral. Este trabajo continuará durante el próximo año.

Dana Marsh se integro a nuestro personal y ha puesto en marcha una impresionante serie de eventos y conciertos, además de propuestas musicales en nuestras liturgias. Una lista parcial incluye un concierto de King's Singers, una serie de conciertos cuaresmales, la visita de la American Boy choir, conciertos como: St. John Passion de Bach, el Réquiem de Mozart, Messiah de Handel, así como el cantar Requiem de Fauré para día de todos los santos y Lecciones y Villancicos de Adviento, tanto en la Catedral como en el seminario teológico cristiano. Los coros tuvieron una subasta en el Colombia Club para recolectar fondos para hacer una visita a la Catedral Nacional, visita que tuvo que ser cancelada cuando la Catedral Nacional fue cerrada debido a terremotos y huracanes. Nuestros niños y niñas han mostrado una paciencia notable, ya el viaje tuvo que ser reprogramado para el próximo mes de junio. Disfrutamos mucho la música clásica de la tradición hispana, con un homenaje a Tomás Luis de Victoria y en la Navidad con los villancicos coloniales del Nuevo Mundo. Dana también fue capaz de llegar a la comunidad y dirigió un coro del festival de siete escuelas secundarias del área en el Palladium, en una interpretación del Réquiem de Fauré. Para nosotros ha sido un año realmente grande musicalmente.

Si hacer música es una de nuestras pasiones, la otra es el alcance a la comunidad. Las subvenciones fueron entregadas a las agencias de un total de \$1,406,780. Fred Andrews, con la ayuda frecuente de Andy McConnell, se ayudaron a 813 personas que vinieron a nuestras puertas con necesidades durante el martes por la mañana. Hemos establecido una nueva asociación con Second Helpings, dándoles un subsidio y también ayudándoles a plantar una hortaliza de vegetales. Seguimos participando con Dayspring refugio para familias, cuidando sus jardines, mientras que nuestros estudiantes de secundaria reúnen donaciones este mes. A través de los feligreses se designaron donaciones a nuestro ministerio las necesidades humanas, así como también la continuación de nuestro apoyo a la Iniciativa de Hambre. Y muchas personas son activas dando, sirviendo y llegando a las familias necesitadas en el comienzo de la escuela con las mochilas y en Navidad con el programa de adoptando familias.

Como una iglesia para nuestra ciudad, nosotros fuimos activos dando la bienvenida los domingos a los desamparados y durante la semana. Dimos la bienvenida a las personas sin hogar, líderes de la comunidad y el Alcalde el 21 de diciembre participaron en la ceremonia conmemorativa anual de las personas sin hogar y los que murieron en

la calle el año pasado. Nosotros, por primera vez, participamos en el servicio interdenominacional de acción de gracias en la Catedral de los Santos Pedro y Pablo, en beneficio de la Iniciativa del Hambre. Nuestros miembros hispanos colocaron un altar del Día de Los Muertos en el Indianapolis Arts Center en el Broad Ripple. Centro de Padres y Familias de Recursos celebraron su ceremonia de graduación de nuevo en la Catedral, cinco grupos de los doce pasos se reúnen semanalmente, con un sexto grupo en español que se está planificando. Participamos de la Fiesta Latina. Y, por supuesto, nuestro festival de la fresa fue de nuevo el evento del año.

Nuestro compromiso internacional continuó con la Diócesis de Ecuador Central. Debido a los conflictos internos, no enviamos un equipo de misión este año, pero se mantuvo el apoyo; el Obispo Presidente ayudo a llegar a una resolución del conflicto. Viajes de la misión se están planeando para el próximo año. En Sudán, se completa el trabajo de construcción en la escuela de Mark Nichols. En Brasil se siguió prestando apoyo a la CASA + ayuda albergue juvenil. Y, finalmente, en Haití, le dimos la bienvenida al obispo Zache Duracin y le presentamos un regalo para la reconstrucción de la Catedral de la Santísima Trinidad. Hemos establecido una asociación entre la Diócesis y Saint. Andre en Mithon. Varios grupos realizaron viajes a Haití. Nuestra generosidad para Haití, con un regalo de 500.000 dólares.

Como la Catedral de nuestra Diócesis, también dimos la bienvenida a un servicio cada vez más grande de confirmaciones diocesanas, El Jueves Santo todo el clero se reunió para la renovación del de los votos de ordenación y de las parroquias vecinas de San Alban y San Felipe nos reunimos para celebrar la Noche de Epifanía.

Hemos aprendido a dar la bienvenida a los recién llegados en una forma mas eficiente, hemos hecho música gloriosa, servido a los demás y también hemos atendido la salud de nuestra comunidad. Hemos aprendido, de muchas oportunidades, para crecer espiritualmente. Mi foro del Domingo sigue atrayendo a nuevos participantes . En el otoño nos enteramos de asuntos de inmigración de una de nuestros propios jóvenes activistas y cómo podemos responder con fidelidad. El catecumenado sigue atrayendo a nuevas personas en nuestra congregación a la fe renovada y algunos al bautismo. Este otoño, comenzamos un grupo de Educación para el Ministerio, con 10 personas que se comprometen a cuatro años de intenso estudio y la reflexión. Durante la Cuaresma, el profesor Paul Valliere nos enseñó acerca de la

oración de Jesús y el Camino de los Peregrinos. Por último, junto con el seminario teológico de Seabury-Western, nos comprometimos con jóvenes académicos que presentaron su recopilación de los primeros temas cristianos en un fin de semana del verano pasado.

Nosotros también tuvimos tiempo para disfrutar y estar juntos. Hemos tenido dos días de campo en el círculo del centro, para comenzar y finalizar nuestro programa de verano, tuvimos juegos, Mariachi, tiendas y mucha diversión. Celebramos el Día de los Muertos, transculturalmente y se colocó un "Altar británico," tal vez el primero! La subasta para recaudar fondos para el viaje del coro, fue una reunión muy divertida para todos. De hecho hubo diversas recepciones y comidas donde estuvimos todos juntos, después de las clases de Adviento y Villancicos, después del desfile de Navidad y Día de la Madre. Tan solo Treinta y cinco personas se reunieron para el almuerzo y la transformación ecológica de la Iglesia.

Es importante tener en cuenta también las transiciones en el liderazgo. La Canon Rees Olander se retiró en junio después de 15 años y muchos logros para mencionar. Tom Craig fue contratado poco después de su jubilación y ha hecho un gran comienzo en el control de nuestros recursos financieros y humanos. Whitney Rice, se dirigió a su nueva parroquia en Bean Blossom, y nuestro nuevo cura, Andy Shamel, comenzó este verano. Simon Jacobs se unió a nosotros como a nuestros compañeros de la música sacra.

Por último, damos las gracias por el liderazgo demostrado por los miembros de esta congregación en la Junta parroquial. Jennifer Segner se ha desempeñado como secretaria durante tres años, manteniendo nuestras actas oficiales de la Junta Parroquial. Deb Jones, Bob Goyette y Andy McConnell ponen fin a su mandato como miembros la Junta Parroquial. Su compromiso y pasión por la Catedral ha sido muy evidente. Andy, en particular, ha servido como guardian menor y mayor. Él trajo una nueva visión y la sabiduría durante estos años con nosotros.

Estoy agradecido de haber servido con ellos el año pasado y esperamos tener otro año al servicio de Cristo en la Catedral. Los hechos descritos en este informe son sólo una parte de la vida que tenemos en este lugar. Que Dios bendiga nuestra vida y ministerio juntos en el próximo año.

I am so grateful to have had this opportunity to serve our congregation. Thanks to Stephen Carlsen for keeping me motivated, to Donna Worth and Anita Farnsley for keeping me organized (as much as that's possible), and to the many people who have graciously offered me your prayers and encouragement.

Treasurer's Report

Last year at this time, we felt assured that we were beginning to emerge from the financial stress caused by the 2008 stock market decline and we predicted a steady rise in our endowment income. You will recall that in early 2009, we reduced our budget to reflect a predicted loss of endowment income for subsequent years. A “Reserve for Known Deficits” was set aside to provide for steady programming in those years, 2011, 2012 and 2013, when the reduction in endowment revenue would most impact our budget. We fully expected that after this time, our endowment revenue would be back to “normal” levels.

This fall, as we reviewed the budget for 2011 and crafted it for 2012, we came to the realization that a “new normal” was very likely emerging, one in which we have no assurance that endowment income will grow at a steady pace. Instead, the Finance Committee predicts that in the foreseeable future, we will continue to see dramatic ups and downs in the market which will require careful attention to how we fund programs and the operations of the Cathedral. These financial circumstances will also require that we look for ways to increase Parish Giving for programs.

In looking at a seven-year comparison of revenues and expenditures using actual numbers from 2008, 2009, 2010, year to date numbers for 2011, and projected numbers for 2012, 2013, and 2014, it became very clear to the Committee that we needed to spread the “Reserve for

Known Deficits” over a three-year period in order to have the time to examine our program and operations costs thoroughly and enhance our ability to increase funding through Parish Giving. Endowment revenues in 2008 were \$583,413 higher than our projected endowment revenues for 2012. Parish giving in 2008 was \$86,859 higher than projected for 2012. (Contributions for the International Hunger Initiative are included in this number.) While we expect to see some growth in endowment revenues, it will take several years to get back to the levels we have seen in the past.

The 2012 budget, recommended to the Vestry and passed at its December meeting, projects total expenditure levels of \$3,568,399 with a deficit of \$200,000. It will also require continued careful management by clergy and staff who have successfully managed resources during these difficult times. By spreading the Reserve for Known Deficits over a three year period, (\$200,000 for each of the next three years), the Cathedral will have time for a thorough review of our programs and operations. It will also give us time to examine Parish Giving and discuss how to better involve our parishioners in funding the initiatives which are most important to us.

Christ Church Cathedral is fortunate to have the endowment left to us by Mr. Lilly and many others who have loved this church and the community it creates. This wealth allows us to help meet important needs in our community, our country and abroad. We will continue to help meet these needs. This “new normal” in the global economy gives us the opportunity to review our own “normal” and make certain that it conforms as much as possible with current needs of our parish, our community at large and to each one of us. Each of us needs to contribute to this important conversation of what it means to be part of this community as we worship together and contribute our time and resources to the programs which are important to us.

Finanzas

El año pasado estábamos seguros que comenzamos a salir de los problemas financieros causados por la pérdida en la bolsa de valores en 2008; además creímos que habría un ingreso estable del legado económico.

Recordaran que a principios del 2009, reducimos el presupuesto ya que se reflejaría la pérdida de la bolsa de valores para los siguientes tres años.

Teníamos una reserva para cubrir el déficit que nos permitiría presupuestar los años del 2011, 2012 y 2013, ya que en este tiempo el impacto de la pérdida sería de mucho más impacto para nuestro presupuesto. Confiábamos en que el legado económico que tenemos en la bolsa de valores volvería a sus niveles normales.

Este otoño cuando recibimos el presupuesto del 2011 y lo programamos para el 2012 nos dimos cuenta que una nueva norma estaba comenzando a emerger, una en la que no tenemos ninguna idea que nos asegure de cómo el legado económico o la bolsa de valores se desarrollara. Todo lo contrario, la bolsa de valores como hemos visto a fluctuado entre altos y bajos, por eso el comité de finanzas requiere que miremos con más cuidado como gastamos el dinero en los programas y los costos de operación de la catedral.

Estas circunstancias financieras también requieren que busquemos la forma de incrementar nuestras ofrendas para financiar los programas.

Comparando siete años de entradas y salidas de los años 2008, 2009, 2010, hasta la fecha y lo proyectado para 2012, 2013, 2014; el comité recomienda poner de nuevo fondos de reserva para sustentar esos

años de presupuestos. Así también nos da tiempo de estudiar nuestros programas y los costos de operación; como también buscar la forma de incrementar las ofrendas.

En el 2008 tuvimos \$583,413 más de lo proyectado del legado económico para el 2012, las ofrendas de la iglesia en el 2008 fueron de \$86,859 más altas que lo proyectado para el 2012

(Las contribuciones de la iniciativa del hambre incluyen esta cantidad.)

Mientras esperamos en crecimiento del legado económico podrían pasar muchos años hasta que veamos que alcance los niveles que hemos tenido en el pasado.

El presupuesto del 2012 recomendado a la junta directiva y aprobado en la reunión de diciembre es de \$3,568,399 con un déficit de \$200,000. Este también requiere de un constante cuidado del manejo de este presupuesto por los sacerdotes y empleados quienes han utilizado los recursos de una forma exitosa en tiempos difíciles.

Al repartir el fondo de reserva de emergencia en los próximos tres años ((\$200,000 por año) La catedral tendrá tiempo de revisar el costo de programas y operaciones. También nos dará tiempo para examinar nuestra forma de ofrendar en la iglesia y de cómo nos podemos involucrar en sostener económicamente los programas que son importantes para nosotros.

La catedral es muy afortunada del legado económico dado por el Sr. Lilly y muchos otros quienes aman a su iglesia y a la comunidad que crea. Esto nos coloca en posición de ayudar a los necesitados de muchos en nuestra comunidad y en el exterior.

Cada uno de nosotros debemos de participar en la conversación de que significa ser parte de esta comunidad; cuando adoramos y alabamos juntos y de cómo contribuimos a los programas y recursos que son importante para nosotros.

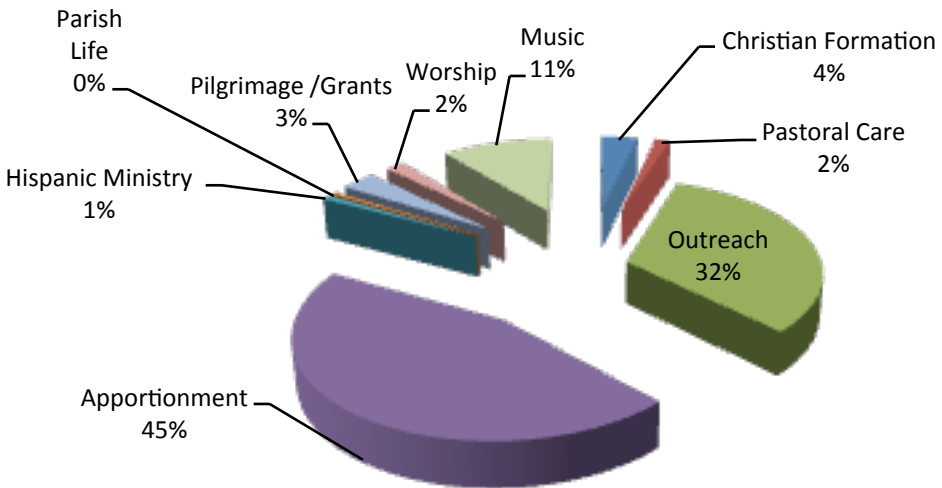
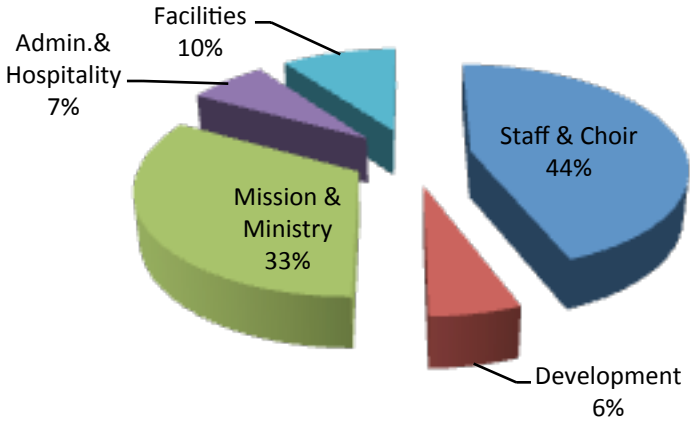

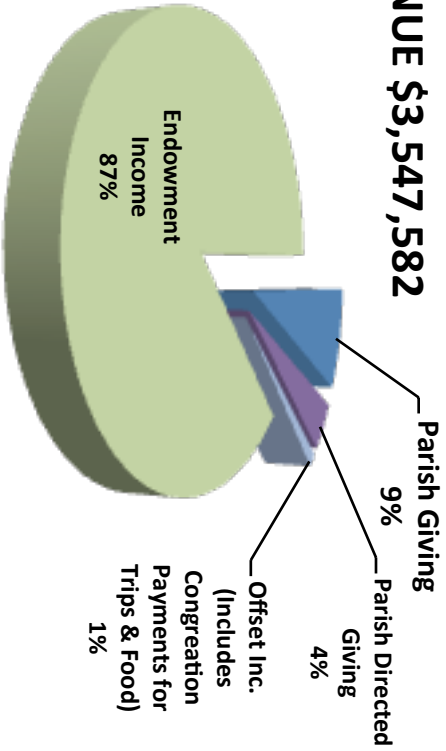

2011 Operating Expenses \$3,536,647



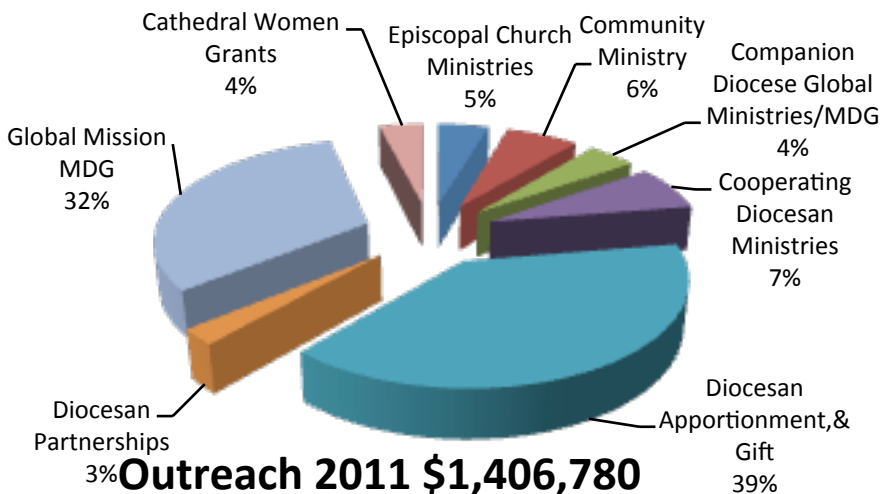

Chalice Bearers

Chalice Bearers are lay people who serve the chalice to communicants at Holy Eucharist. We vest and participate as part of the altar party to minister at the altar with clergy and acolyte servers.

Training is provided, and the major time requirement is reliable availability on Sundays when you are scheduled to serve.

Stephen Ministry

Stephen Ministers are members of the Christ Church Cathedral congregation who provide one-on-one confidential, Christ-focused caregiving to our fellow Christians in times of transition, loss, change, need, or crisis. We have undergone 50 hours of intensive training and most of us meet with a care receiver once or twice a month for listening, caregiving, and journeying together with the person in our charge. Sometimes, we meet with someone once or twice, and some of our caregivers have accompanied their care receivers for more than three years.

Since confidentiality is the crux of our ministry, much of what Stephen Ministers do is behind the scenes. In 2011, over 20 Stephen Ministers were active in the Cathedral community, with some of us caring for multiple care receivers. We help to create a loving, caring Christian community that welcomes all through our doors with Christ-centered care.

We offer training at least once a year, and are planning our next training for summer 2012. Our training is a big commitment (50 hours), but we shape it in a way that we hope isn't exceptionally burdensome to you. There is an interview process for people interested in becoming a Stephen Minister, mostly to ensure that there is a match for both the inquirer and for our ministry. St. Theresa's Guild

St. Theresa's Guild cares for and keeps in touch with the homebound members of the Cathedral congregation through birthday cards, phone calls and visits, and special gifts and remembrances during the Easter and Christmas seasons. Marcia Stone (244-8333) is our ministry coordinator, and she'd be delighted to welcome newcomers. Lots of this ministry is done on your own, and with only two or three coordinating meetings a year, most of our work is done in visits, cards, and calls. Ours is a perfect ministry for someone who enjoys brightening another's day!

Altar Guild Report

The Altar Guild (AG) welcomes any new members who are interested in setting the Lord's table. We are a behind the scenes ministry that allows time for quiet reflection. Newcomers are taught to prepare for the Eucharist and reverently handle the Body and Blood afterwards. Members develop an intimate acquaintance with our cathedral traditions by preparing for and participating in our weekly and special services. Members are taught to care for our cathedral's treasures, such as the silver and gold vessels, many of which are inscribed with our parish history.

Annual Meeting Minutes
January 25, 2011**

The Annual Parish meeting was called to order by the Very Rev. Stephen Carlsen at 7:15 PM following Evensong and dinner. Dean Carlsen welcomed us and led us in prayer.

He then introduced the clergy and staff of the Cathedral and appointed Donna Worth as clerk for the meeting and Marilyn Schultz as head teller. He called for a motion to approve the minutes of the 2010 Annual Parish Meeting as shown in the Annual Report. (I have no idea who made the motion to approve and who seconded). The motion passed by voice vote.

Dean Carlsen thanked the retiring Vestry members Simon Crookall, John Wehr, and Susanah Mead.
