**Agency/Ministry                      Agency Description, Project Description and Funds Awarded**

<p><b>Alternatives Incorporated of Madison County</b></p>	<p>Provides emergency shelter to victims of domestic violence in six Indiana counties (Hamilton, Hancock, Henry, Marion, Madison and Tipton) since 1978. Our funding helped pay for food and shelter supplies and shelter occupancy/utilities. Granted Amount \$9,700.00</p>
<p><b>Damar Foundation</b></p>	<p>Damar offers services to a range of people living with behavioral and developmental disabilities. Funding will go towards Basic Client Needs Program, which provides residential clients with clothing, hygiene items, replacement glasses, bus fare, and sensory items which are not covered by the clients' Medicaid or SSI/SSDI. Granted amount \$4,000 ***NOT YET FUNDED***</p>
<p><b>Dayspring Center</b></p>	<p>Dayspring is an emergency homeless shelter that has fed, sheltered, clothed and assisted at least 320 families with children in the past 2 years. Funding supported building repairs, meals, supplies and utilities. Granted Amount \$30,000.00</p>
<p><b>Exodus Refugee Immigration</b></p>	<p>Exodus provides resettlement services to refugees from around the world who are invited into the country by the United Department of State. Funding supported the Refugee Women's Self Sufficiency program. Granted Amount \$11,500.00 ***NOT YET FUNDED***</p>
<p><b>John P. Craine House</b></p>	<p>Craine House offers an alternative sentencing program dedicated to serving non-violent females with preschool children. Programs teach women educational skills for self-sufficiency. Mothers have at least one felony. The funding was for a hands-on culinary vocational program to learn food preparation and serving jobs. Granted Amount \$15,000.00 ***NOT YET FUNDED***</p>
<p><b>The Julian Center</b></p>	<p>Emergency shelter for victims of domestic violence which provides crisis intervention to 1,400 non-residential domestic violence incidents. The funding supported their Safe Kids program. Purchases include new regulated seats for mealtime and training for parents to use these seats, developmental training for safety of children exposed to violence at home, and body safety training. Granted amount \$10,000</p>
<p><b>Little Red Door Cancer Agency</b></p>	<p>Little Red Door Cancer Agency works to reduce the burdens of cancer for medically underserved residents of central Indiana. Grant will fund ambulatory trips for low income families. These trips will transport patients to and from their cancer treatment and follow up oncology appointments. Granted Amount \$5,000.00 ***NOT YET FUNDED***</p>
<p><b>Mother Hubbard's Cupboard</b></p>	<p>Pantry located in Bloomington, Indiana with the mission to increase access to healthy food for all people in ways that cultivate dignity, self-sufficiency and community. Serves 3,800 individuals each week. Funds were used for food pantry supplies and also Nutrition, Garden and Youth Education programs. Granted Amount \$9,000</p>
<p><b>Providence Food Pantry</b></p>	<p>Providence Food Pantry provides meat, produce, canned goods, paper products and other essential supplies to the residents of West Terre Haute whose income is below the federal poverty level. They serve over 300 families during the year. Money used to purchase food for pantry. Granted Amount \$15,000</p>
<p><b>St. Philip's Episcopal Church</b> <i>Feeding Ministry</i></p>	<p>Feeding ministry that has been in continuous operation for 35 years. They offer a weekly bag of groceries to elderly and mobility-impaired individuals and also provide a weekly community meal. Funding helped purchase food and hygiene products. Granted Amount \$14,000.00</p>
<p><b>St. Thomas Episcopal Church</b> <i>Medical Clinic</i></p>	<p>This is a free medical clinic, an outreach of St. Thomas Episcopal Church, that operates two sessions a week so low-income, uninsured Johnson County residents can receive free medical care, medications, nursing and pharmacy. Funding provided laboratory testing services, prescriptions for patients, women's health exams, and smoking cessation programs. Granted Amount \$12,000.00</p>
<p><b>St. Timothy's Episcopal</b> <i>Loaves &amp; Fishes Food Pantry</i></p>	<p>This feeding ministry began in the fall of 2007 and feeds approximately 100 families each month. Funding was used to purchase food, toiletries and baby products. Granted Amount \$15,000.00</p>
<p><b>The Sharing Place</b> <i>Food Pantry</i></p>	<p>The Sharing Place is a food pantry that also dispenses disposable diapers and clothing for infants thru 18 years. It is located on the near Eastside serving families and individuals below the poverty level and living in crisis situations. They have also added food preparation and nutrition classes. Funds were used for food and hygiene products. Granted Amount \$12,000.00</p>
<p><b>The Storehouse at St. John's Episcopal Church</b></p>	<p>The Storehouse is a feeding ministry committed to help end hunger in their community, serving those in need with dignity and respect. Staffed by volunteers, they serve up to 176 families monthly. They are also building a relationship with four Speedway Elementary Schools by helping support Gleaners Back sack program for students. Funding used to purchase items for food pantry. Granted Amount \$15,000.00</p>
