THE FIRST READING: Revelation 7:9-17




THE SECOND READING: 1 John 3:1-3

THE HOLY GOSPEL: Matthew 5:1-12 *Standing*

Gospeller: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew.

THE SERMON

The Very Rev. Mary Slenski

THE RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS *Standing. Said by all.*

Presider: Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

People: **I do.**

Presider: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Presider: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.**

Presider: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

People: **I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**

Presider: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Presider: Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Presider: Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Presider: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Presider: Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

People: **I will, with God's help.**

Presider: May Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given us a new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and bestowed upon us the forgiveness of sins, keep us in eternal life by his grace, in Christ Jesus our Lord. **Amen.**

In the course of the silence after each bidding, the People offer their own prayers, either silently or aloud.

Leader: I ask your prayers for the good earth which God has given us, and for the wisdom and will to conserve it, for the right use of the riches of creation, that the world may be freed from poverty, famine, and disaster, Stir up in us a thirst for justice that protects the earth and all its resources.

Pray for the wisdom and will to conserve the beauty and abundance of the earth.

Silence

Leader: I ask your prayers for the poor, the sick, the hungry, the oppressed, and those in prison. Pray especially for Catherine, David and Ruth, Michael, Darrin, Bethany and Philip, Maria, Maureen, Melissa, Chevo, Beatrice, Lilian, Jude, and for the Convention Delegates, the Neighborhoods of the Diocese, and all those involved in our Annual Convention.

Pray for those in any need or trouble.

Silence

Leader: I ask your prayers of wisdom, creativity, and perseverance for all medical professionals, researchers, policy makers, and leaders in finding and developing the resources, medical skill, and political will to contain and end this COVID-19 pandemic.

Pray for those infected with COVID-19 and those who care for them.

Silence

Leader: I ask your prayers for the departed, especially Pedro Andrade, and for those who have lost their lives to COVID-19, gun violence, and natural disasters.

Pray for those who have died.

Silence

Presider: Almighty God, to whom our needs are known before we ask: Help us to ask only what accords with your will; and those good things which we dare not, or in our blindness cannot ask, grant us for the sake of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen.
