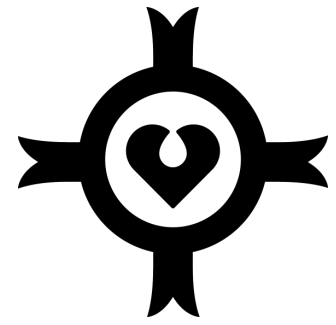


Sunday Announcements, June 6, 2021
