

THE FIRST READING: Isaiah 53:4-12 *Seated*

Surely he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; yet we accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth. By a perversion of justice he was taken away. Who could have imagined his future? For he was cut off from the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people. They made his grave with the wicked and his tomb with the rich, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth. Yet it was the will of the Lord to crush him with pain. When you make his life an offering for sin, he shall see his offspring, and shall prolong his days; through him the will of the Lord shall prosper. Out of his anguish he shall see light; he shall find satisfaction through his knowledge. The righteous one, my servant, shall make many righteous, and he shall bear their iniquities. Therefore I will allot him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he poured out himself to death, and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

THE SECOND READING: Hebrews 4:12-16

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honor, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was. So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him, "You are my Son, today I have begotten you"; as he says also in another place, "You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek." In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

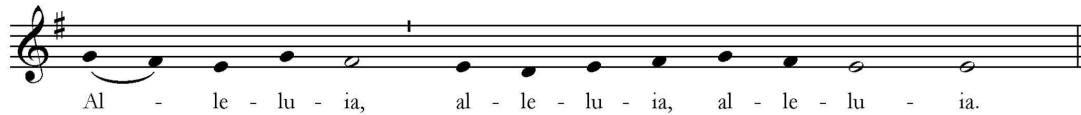

## THE HOLY GOSPEL: Mark 10:35-45

*Gospeller:* The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

*People:* **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to Jesus and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." And he said to them, "What is it you want me to do for you?" And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" They replied, "We are able." Then Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared." When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. THE NICENE CREED *Standing as able*

It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Almighty God, Creator of heaven and earth. For you are the source of light and life, you made us in your image, and called us to new life in Jesus Christ our Lord. Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Holy and gracious God: In your infinite love you made us for yourself, and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and maker of all. Jesus stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world. On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Savior Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in Christ. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom. All this we ask through Jesus Christ our Savior: By Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and for ever. **AMEN.**

MUSIC NOTES: At age 104, Francis Jackson, who composed today's Mass setting, is still active, playing the organ and composing. Jackson's musical life is encompassed almost entirely at York Minster, where he sang as a chorister then was Organist and Choirmaster from 1946 to 1982. Jackson was trained at York Minster by his predecessor, Edward C. Bairstow, who took the post in 1913, meaning that music at York was led by Bairstow or Jackson for the staggering span of 69 years!

Christ Church Cathedral is a spiritual hub of transformation for our city and diocese, following Jesus Christ in practicing radical hospitality, working for justice, and proclaiming God's peace, reconciliation, and love.

### **Mission: *How do we live into and work toward the vision on a daily basis?***

### **Pillars of the Plan:**

#### **Convener/connector for our city and diocese**

1. Serve as a **principal catalyst** in gathering neighbors on the Circle and local nonprofits for important conversations, particularly focusing on issues affecting our neighbors in the margins.
2. Take on a **greater leadership role** in hosting diocesan trainings and events, especially those that focus on equity, anti-racism, and inclusion work--collaborate more and sooner.
3. Serve as the **primary connector** between downtown congregations (both diocesan and ecumenical).
4. Build **better relationships** with and (in some cases) make amends with other congregations where we have been culpable for harm, including systemic racism.
5. **CHILDREN & YOUTH:** Be a primary gathering place/launching point for **diocesan-wide youth hands-on social justice activities**.

#### **Radical hospitality**

1. Regularly offer "**outward facing**" **activities** (liturgies, activities, public art) on our lawn.
2. Communicate our missional priorities, Baptismal Covenant, and bilingual identity through more **creative use of lawn, signage, and buildings**.
3. Invite nonprofits, partners, and neighborhood groups to **use our buildings** on a more regular basis.
4. Enhance our Sunday **Community Breakfast** partnerships to offer social services resources, music/art, and spiritual companionship to guests.
5. Intentionally make strong connections with the **millennials** and **empty nesters** living in the Mile Square neighborhood and with the broader **Latino community in Indianapolis**, meeting them where they already gather and connect rather than expecting them to come to us.
6. Renew our **Sunday "guest experience"** by refreshing our systems of welcome and integration (e.g. ushers, greeters, newcomer integration/connections).
7. Reinvent our **meal services** to connect with our missional priorities (see below in Faith in Action).  
**CHILDREN & YOUTH:** Make intentional connections with downtown and near-Northside families who may be attracted to our social justice and missional values.

## Deep beauty of God (Worship/Music/Arts)

1. **CHILDREN & YOUTH:** Reinvent our **chorister program** into a vibrant, every day, after-school program that builds relationships with local public schools to offer music, activities, homework help, and food.
2. Forge stronger partnerships with **local arts organizations** and regularly feature local artists' work in the Cathedral building and on our lawn.
3. Be intentional about integrating **diverse music and more experiential liturgical practices that appeal to the senses** into our regular worship.
4. Reinvent our **concert series** with stronger local partnerships with arts organizations.
5. Explore possibilities for adding an **additional weekend worship service** that is different from current offerings.

## Spirituality formed in community

1. Regularly offer both **traditional and non-traditional learning opportunities and specialty liturgies** (e.g. Ashes to Go, Bible study, EFM, Pub Theology) in locations outside of the church, both downtown and in "satellite" locations (e.g. 86th Street, Irvington, south side).
2. Reshape **adult formation classes** to meet the needs of diverse learning styles, languages, entry levels, and schedules. Create more holistic opportunities to learn, share a meal, and serve together.
3. Develop an **intentional ministry of small groups** that meet in people's homes and in the community to build fellowship and spirituality within and among our entire congregation.
4. **CHILDREN & YOUTH:** Completely **overhaul our children and youth formation programs**, keeping in mind that some of the formation may happen during weekdays with our chorister program.

## Living our faith in action

1. Narrow and refocus our outreach partnerships to **three key priorities** that directly affect the neighborhoods and people around us. Create meaningful, transformative opportunities **for our congregation to engage in a hands-on way with local nonprofit partner(s)** working in three of these areas (to be determined through congregation feedback):
  - a. **homelessness**
  - b. **immigration**
  - c. **dismantling/disrupting systemic racism**
  - d. **food insecurity in the downtown area**
  - e. **environmental stewardship**
2. Align our **Covenant Grants** program and our **advocacy partnership funding** with our three missional priorities (above).
3. Invest a portion of our **endowment** in missional-related investments (that provide both an economic and social return) that align with the priorities above.
4. Refocus our **Global Ministry** to work with Indianapolis-area migrants.
5. **CHILDREN AND YOUTH:** Create stronger opportunities for youth to activate their passions and be leaders in outreach.
