





THE FIRST READING: Isaiah 11:1-10 *Seated*

A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord. His delight shall be in the fear of the Lord. THE NICENE CREED *Standing as able*



The flowers at the altar today are given to the Glory of God and in thanksgiving for the Ordination to the Diaconate yesterday of Yuri Rodríguez-Laureani.

MUSIC NOTES: Conductor and composer André Thomas is one of the most influential conductor and teachers of our day. Having spent his career leading choirs and teaching conducting at Florida State University, Thomas has shaped generations of choirs and conductors. His arrangements of spirituals, including his haunting setting of *Keep your lamps*, have become staples of the repertoire for collegiate and church choirs. Today's service is framed by two setting of the Lutheran chorale *Nun komm, der Heiden Heiland*. Bach wrote three settings of this chorale, all contained in his Great Eighteen collection, which are all chorale based. Each setting refers to a specific stanza of the chorale's text. The two we hear today typify two different styles, the ornamental chorale, where the tune is highly embellished, to be the point of being unrecognizable, and the accompanimental material is drawn from the tune itself, and the chorale fantasia, where a figure in perpetual motion, based loosely on the tune, is played in full organ over the tune in long notes in the pedal.
