The Gospel of John

FAQs:

What is it? The Good Book Club is an invitation to join Episcopalians across the church and read the Gospel of John through the season of Advent readings. A schedule of readings is provided for Monday – Saturday.

What Bible should I read? Does it matter? Whatever Bible, in whatever format, audio, digital, paperback, hardback, all that matters is that it's the one that you'll engage. Read your favorite or try a different translation.

Is there any cost? Only in your time to read. If you don't have a bible, or can't afford to buy one, let one of the clergy know.

OK. So, I've read it. Now what? Reading is enough. You are part of a faithful community engaging God's Word in an intentional way this winter. Wonder about what God might be up to through this reading. If you want more...pay attention to how your day goes. Did something come to mind from the reading? Some find these questions helpful:

- What happened? What does the text say?
- What excited, or surprised you? Any other emotions arise?
- What does the text mean?
- How does what you read apply to you?

What if I want to know more about the reading?

At the Cathedral, Sunday mornings at 9 am, in the Parish Hall, join others including one of our staff clergy at a table for questions, discussion, and small group reflection. We will do the same after the 1 pm service as schedule permits.
